






Allocations for 2014 - 2019



The allocation considers the membership count of the previous year (as of July 1st), and is calculated as:

$$\text{Allocation} = (\text{member count} \times \$11) + \$500$$

$$\text{2014 allocation} \rightarrow (910 \text{ members} \times \$11) + \$500 = \$10,510$$

$$\text{2015 allocation} \rightarrow (874 \text{ members} \times \$11) + \$500 = \$10,114$$

$$\text{2016 allocation} \rightarrow (893 \text{ members} \times \$11) + \$500 = \$10,323$$

$$\text{2017 allocation} \rightarrow (865 \text{ members} \times \$11) + \$500 = \$10,015$$

$$\text{2018 allocation} \rightarrow (837 \text{ members} \times \$11) + \$4,500^{**} = \$13,707$$

$$\text{2019 allocation} \rightarrow (866 \text{ members} \times \$11) + \$4,500 = \$14,246$$
