We seek an exceptional colleague with a record of research excellence in Nonprofit Management. Qualified candidates must have a Ph.D. at the time of application and will have a scholarly record appropriate to the academic rank of the appointment that includes peer-reviewed scholarly publications, an active research agenda, and experience or commitment to teaching courses on the nonprofit sector, nonprofit management, and strategic planning, marketing and fundraising. Ideal candidates will have a record of, or commitment to, seeking external funding. Responsibilities will include maintaining a high impact research agenda that has the potential to appear in top field and specialty journals, teaching a full breadth of nonprofit management courses, and advising students.
