

Presenter shares material with attendees. Communication through chat. No Breakout rooms.

Live Synchronous Open Meeting style

Presenter and attendees can share material. Attendees can raise hands. Breakout rooms are available.

On demand Asynchronous

(pre-recorded and available at any time for viewing). No Zoom component. Attendees can upload material as well. Communication takes place through chat.

Advice for conference preparation

- 1. Prepare your session participation and attendance in advance.
- 2. If you're a presenter, I encourage you to set up an appointment with a technician who can help you if you have questions or concerns.
- 3. During the sessions, an army of technicians from *Projectionnet* (around 100) will be available for support. One will stay the whole time in each session.

- 5. Deadline to upload your supplemental material via the site www.projectionnet.com is 14 July 2021. After that date, a technician will have to do it.
- 6. Connect 10mins in advance to take care of any technical issue.

The labs will address the needs and concerns of our members across three areas: consulting, teaching, and research. The first lab scheduled for this fall will focus on consulting. The objective of this lab is to gain an understanding of the challenges with which management consultants encounter in today's post covid environment with the overarching goal of advancing management consulting research and practice among our members. A small panel of consultants representing top-tier, mid-tier, and boutique consulting firms will share what they view as the major issues with which management consultants are confronting today, and in the years ahead. Participants will engage in a lively dialogue with industry leaders and identify key areas of research and practice that need to be explored, advanced or invented. The first virtual learning lab is scheduled for September 28 at 12 noon Eastern Standard Time.
