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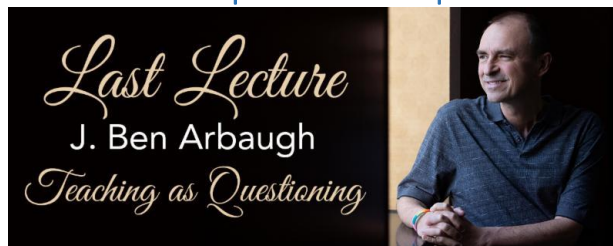
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MED Announcement

The first faculty member to offer an online course in UW Oshkosh College of Business,

J. Ben Arbaugh is truly a pioneer in business education. Beyond recognition by professional colleagues in his field, his impact has been felt for more than two decades in the classroom at UW Oshkosh and beyond.

Ben's cancer journey started as a simple case of hiccups while eating in November 2016. Over the next couple of months symptoms progressively became more persistent ending with several doctor visits. Eventually a scan revealed a three centimeter tumor at the bottom of his esophagus close to where it connects with the stomach. Ben was diagnosed with Stage III B Adenocarcinoma of the esophagus. Although doctors were initially hopeful of his ability to beat the cancer, he has been recently removed from active treatment and is under hospice care at home.

True to Ben's fashion, he plans to try to finish out the semester as planned. Please join us in honoring his 24 years of teaching and service at UW Oshkosh.

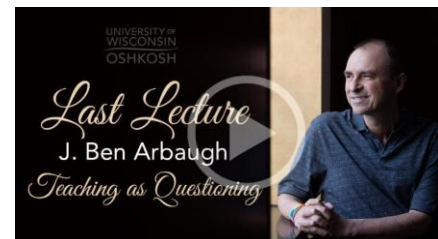

Ben has been Editor of *Academy of Management Learning & Education* (AMLE). He also was **Chair of the Management Education and Development (MED) Division of the Academy of Management in 2006-2007**. A six-time Academy of Management Division Best Paper award winner, he received the 2001 Roethlisberger Award for the Best Article in the *Journal of Management Education*, and a Best Article Award in the *Decision Sciences Journal of Innovative Education*. Ben's 2000 article "Virtual classroom characteristics and student satisfaction with internet-based MBA courses" has just been selected as the recipient of the "2018 Lasting Impact Award" by the *Journal of Management Education*; this award recognizes that article as essentially starting the conversation about online learning, and its empirical novelty.

Ben is one of the first two-time winners of the UW Online MBA Consortium Outstanding Faculty Award (2012, 2017). In 2011, Ben became the second College of Business faculty member to be named a John McNaughton Rosebush Professor, UW Oshkosh's highest award for faculty. Other UW Oshkosh honors include the 2008 Outstanding COB Graduate Faculty Award and the 2009 Management and Human Resources Department Teaching Award. He sits (or has served) on the Editorial Review Boards for the *Journal of Management Education*, *Management Learning*, *Decision Sciences Journal of Innovative Education*, the *Journal of Management, Spirituality, and Religion*, and the *International Journal of Management Reviews*.
