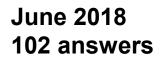

Allocations for 2013 - 2018



The allocation considers the membership count of the previous year (as of July 1st), and is calculated as:

Allocation = (member count x \$11) + \$500 2013 allocation \rightarrow (907 members x \$11) + \$500 = \$10,477 2014 allocation \rightarrow (910 members x \$11) + \$500 = \$10,510 2015 allocation \rightarrow (874 members x \$11) + \$500 = \$10,114 2016 allocation \rightarrow (893 members x \$11) + \$500 = \$10,323 2017 allocation \rightarrow (865 members x \$11) + \$500 = \$10,015 2018 allocation \rightarrow (837 members X \$11) + \$4,500** = \$13,707 2019 allocation \rightarrow (866 members X \$11) + \$4,500 = \$14,246
