The Olin Business School at Washington University in St. Louis invites applications for a Post-Doctoral Fellowship in the area of Organizational Behavior. The selected candidate will have the opportunity to continue their research while collaborating with faculty and doctoral students on new projects. The two-year position will provide teaching opportunities as well.

Reflecting a vibrant and supportive research environment, WashU Olin is rated highly in terms of research productivity. Over the past several years, faculty in the OB area have published in outlets such as the <u>Academy of Management</u> <u>Journal</u>, <u>Academy of Management Review</u>, <u>Administrative Science Quarterly</u>, <u>Journal of Applied Psychology</u>, <u>Journal of Personality and Social Psychology</u>, <u>Organizational Behavior and Human Decision Processes</u>, and <u>Organization Science</u>. Members currently sit on the editorial boards and/or serve as associate editors at top journals in the field such as ASQ, AMJ, OBHDP, Management Science, and Organization Science.

Required Qualifications

Applicants must have earned their Ph.D. or be close to completion in Organizational Behavior, Management, or a relevant behavioral science discipline such as psychology or sociology.

Components of a complete application are: cover letter of interest, current CV, copies of published or unpublished works (no more than three, please), and two CONFIDENTIAL letters of recommendation sent on your behalf by the reviewer (or assistant), uploaded through Interfolio.

Reviews of complete application packets will begin immediately. For fullest consideration, candidates will need to submit their application by February 28, 2019. However, the search will continue until the position has been filled.
