Selection criteria:

- All current SIM members are eligible to submit a manuscript for consideration.
- Submissions should be 40 pages at maximum, including references, tables, figures, etc.
- Both theoretical and empirical papers are eligible.
- You may send a paper that is being presented at AOM or another conference, but not a manuscript that is currently under review at a journal.
- Please note that the workshop is limited to 25 participants; should the workshop be oversubscribed, current Ph.D. students and early career scholars will be given priority.
- **Manuscripts should be submitted as MS-WORD documents and should NOT be anonymous.**

Acceptance to the Research Development Workshop is competitive. Applicants should submit their papers by **11:59 p.m. on June 3rd ET**, using the form [here](#). Workshop candidates will be notified of their paper's acceptance by **June 17th**.
