Job Description

Successful applicants are expected to have a PhD degree in Information Systems, or related fields (i.e. Management, Marketing, Economics, Computer Science), and demonstrate a strong interest and a proven track record in teaching at MSc levels and a proven track record in this respect.

Employment Conditions

The conditions of employment comply with the collective labour agreement for Dutch Universities (CAO NU). The lecturer appointment runs from 1 January 2021 until 30 June 2021, which can be extended. Erasmus University Rotterdam has attractive employment conditions, which include a holiday allowance of 8 per cent, an end-of-year bonus of 8.3 per cent, and a generous number of vacation days. Favourable tax agreements may apply to non-Dutch applicants.
